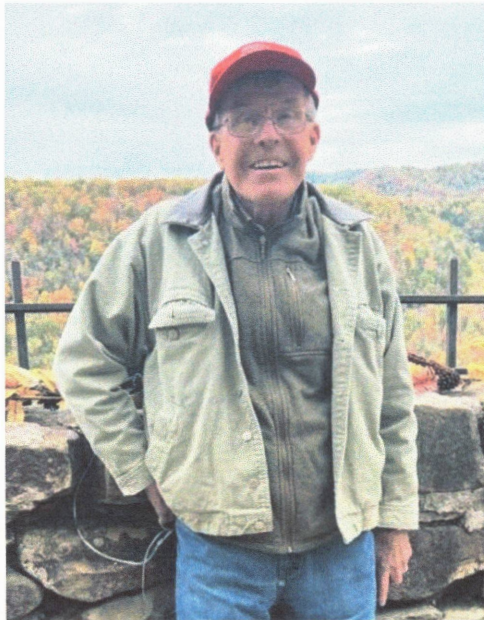


Charles Halstead 04092026

Among Mr. Halstead's passions was establishing a program at Recovery Point in [Huntington, West Virginia](#), known as SOD (Serving Others Dailey). Through this effort, he taught men to cultivate a garden; however, the mission extended beyond gardening, as he also shared Bible lessons that were new to many participants. He devoted himself wholeheartedly to the program until his health no longer allowed him to continue.

Funeral services will be conducted at 11:00 a.m. Tuesday, April 14, at Allen Funeral Home, with Pastor Jeff Davenport officiating. Interment will follow at Forest Memorial Park in Milton, West Virginia. Visitation will be held from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. Monday at Allen Funeral Home, and also for one hour prior to the service on Tuesday.
